The NWT-PWR-12V-LI6500 is a compact, rugged lithium iron phosphate (LiFePO4) power bank designed to deliver reliable 12V DC power for field-deployed radios, networking equipment, and portable electronics where conventional power is unavailable. Built on LiFePO4 chemistry, it offers improved safety, thermal stability, and long cycle life compared to standard lithium-ion. With an 83.2Wh capacity, multiple DC and USB outputs, a 4-LED capacity indicator, and a physical power switch, it provides stable, intuitive power for a wide range of mobile and remote applications.
